Women of Courage on Film







Earlier this summer, CultureLink initiated the Women of Courage program; a community-building program for racialized immigrant women over the age of 40. We have met three groups of strong, artistic, courageous and visionary women.

In weekly sessions they have reflected on their identity, immigration and their experiences as newcomers in Canada, some having escaped war-torn and crisis areas. They also had expert facilitators guide them through writing, art, social media and other storytelling techniques.

Within the first few months, these women were faced with unfamiliar spaces, being separated from loved ones while also being subject to systematic racism, all the while still trying to find jobs and an adequate living space for their family.

Amid all their struggles, however, they stood strong and resilient. And through their stories they teach us just what courage looks like.

We are proud to host a program that allows these women to take up space and use their voices. In 2023 their stories will be showcased in many museums in Toronto. In the meanwhile, look for small samples across our platforms.
